Pre UG points	Task
40	 Review and analyse a piece of theatre you have already seen. You may recall a piece containing an acting performance that particularly impressed you or the vision and direction of the piece may have inspired you. What impressed you about the performances of the actors? What inspired you about the vision and direction of the piece?
60	 Analyse and compare/contrast two pieces of theatre you have seen. How did they differ? What different response/emotion did they provoke? How did the staging, concept, vision and semiotics differ? Was one your favourite, if so why?
80	 Watch at least one of the below films. Review and analyse the performance of at least one of the actors. You can do this in written form. You should choose specific moments from the film to comment on, as well as giving your overall opinion on their performance. (They are all great films, both in terms of the performances the actors give and the way in which they are made, why not give them all a watch? Embrace varying genres and styles and give something new a go!)
