## **Getting ready for A Level German**

We are very pleased to welcome you to the A Level German. There is a natural progression from GCSE to AS Level and many of the AS topics build upon your GCSE knowledge.

Language skills need to be practised – if you don't use it, you lose it! It is very important that you don't forget things you've covered throughout school so far!!

In order to be fully prepared for September, please work through the tasks in the booklet. Some of the tasks are designed to revise GCSE topics which will form the basis of AS topics. There are also grammar tasks and some activities to help you to develop your cultural awareness.

- Do something most days (even if just 10 minutes) and certainly, at least 1 hour per week on average
- Do not leave it until the last minute – language learning is best in small chunks.

**Please keep all of your GCSE exercise books and notes.**

**Task 6 – create a presentation in ENGLISH about an aspect of German culture/life that interests you. Choose one of the following:**

- A film relating to German culture (or at least in German)
- Something about music in the German speaking world
- Aspects of German history (post war, division, reunification etc)
- Fashion in the German speaking world
- The Geography of part of the German speaking world

**30 points**

Choose your theme and research it, then plan a presentation to deliver in front of the class on your return. This is not meant to be a test of what you can remember, but an opportunity to show off what you have found out throughout your research. You could just stand and talk, you could give out information, but please make sure you are ready to do this in September.

You should include information about the aspect of culture/life in the German speaking world, and also information about why you chose that topic.
