We have seen these qualities during our visits this year which include meetings with parent/carers, staff, students, looking at Safeguarding, attending school trips, sports day and the amazing production of Matilda.

We know staff continue to give generously of their time beyond the school day, despite ongoing industrial action, offering a large variety of enrichment activities and after school activities.

I was particularly struck that some of our most vulnerable learners were supported to participate in sports day making it a truly inclusive experience.

During visits, staff provide students with whom we meet to listen to their views on what is going well and their suggestions which will improve the Tuxford experience. These are always passed onto senior leaders.

All visits are discussed at the twice termly Academy Committee Meetings. We are very pleased with the quality of education and acknowledge the openness of all staff to any learning from such visits.

Governors take concerns and complaints very seriously and do their best to investigate and report in a fair and transparent manner. There is always learning for the Academy in such circumstances.

We are keen to improve our links with parents/ carers and the wider community. In addition to the parents' support group meeting to which all are invited, we will attempt to be present at all school events and welcome your thoughts on how we can improve our community links or any other matter you wish to discuss.
