AC/92/23/24	Academy Presentation The principal and Ms Ashton, Assistant Principal delivered a presentation on Student Personal Development Including EDI & AIP. A copy of the presentation will be circulated to governors after the meeting. The vision is To grow and celebrate every student's character to equip them to contribute fully to society and pursue their ambitions. Through the establishment of: - An ethos team to lead personal development - A well-sequenced academic and pastoral curriculum - The Tuxford Academy Ethos Award celebrating character development	
	A governor asked how the Tuxford Academy ethos award operates and how is the tracking monitored. The principal replied class charts will be removed from September 2024 and Weduc will be the mechanism used for tracking across the Trust.	
	A governor further asked will the academy take school trips into consideration and how accessible are they for students to access with regard to finances. The principal replied a piece of work is in progress regarding trips and awards, some students may gain more via school events. The principal confirmed there are internal and external opportunities for students to undertake.	
	A governor asked do opportunities internally and externally carry equal weighting. Ms Ashton replied this is currently under review and the Team will decide in due course. The ways to achieve the character strands are divided into 4: Conscientiousness Open mindedness Resilience	
	 Engaging with others Ms Ashton stated the team feel the current hours are achievable ie: Bronze 20, Silver 25, Gold 30 hours. 	
	A governor stated students must be able to qualify for the hours without a cost being attached. The principal replied it is all about engagement, it is irrelevant where students undertake the hours be it internal or external.	
	Ms Ashton stated the system will be slightly more challenging for KS4 criteria with an ownership on leadership rather than participation. In addition, the main information strands will come via form time, i.e. what does it mean and look like. It will be linked to CEIAG and careers.	
	A governor asked is the communication part of the shared team's approach. The principal replied to moving tutor time is creating the opportunity for a slightly different approach, ensuring it is tangible.

	This session was led by Miss Wilkins and provided lots of statical data to demonstrate that the understanding and awareness of the LGBTQ+ still requires action to get positive inclusion and visibility throughout society. The academy has achieved many things within its student community, particular note should be made of the Rainbow Flag Award this academic year. However external influences on students are still difficult for the school to counter. It was stated that the best way to combat these external influences were through consistent messaging in line with the academy's stance.	
	Mr Charnock stated he had met with a group of four students and would like to make a special mention to Charlotte a P16 student whom displayed excellent leadership skills with positive humour.
